Becky Wilcox Memorial Scholarship (Nursing)

This scholarship is established as a non-expandable trust from a one-time donation of \$10,000 and subsequent donations totaling \$425,000 by Alfred Wilcox, father of Becky Wilcox. Becky Wilcox was a 1961 graduate of JHS who died at the age of 19 while a student in nursing at the University of Cincinnati. It is to be awarded as a scholarship to a graduating senior from JHS who is preparing to become a nurse.

The selection committee is to be made up of the president of the board of education who will serve as chairperson, the high school principal, a teacher of senior students, a teacher of upper division science classes and a counselor who works with senior students.

Carol M. Evans Memorial Scholarship- teaching

This scholarship was established in Memory of Carol M. Evans in the Spring of 2008. Mrs. Evans was a long-time educator in Jackson City School District. The scholarship is intended to encourage post-secondary study in the area of Teacher Education. The award is made possible by community contributions and is administered by Debby Crabtree and Randy Evans.

Members of the senior class who have maintained a 3.0 grade point average through the seventh semester are eligible to apply. The applicant's goals, potential for success, and financial aid will be considered.

The scholarship committee shall consist of the JHS Principal, JHS Counselor, Debby Crabtree and Randy Evans.

Dale Rose Memorial Baseball Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Dale Rose, husband of long time JHS guidance counselor Nina Rose. This fund was established to assist a Senior member of the JHS baseball team (must have played baseball two years at JHS) to pursue post-secondary study. Applicants must have dedication, hustle, discipline, leadership, integrity and honor.

Cheryl Crosier Wilson Nursing Scholarship Fund

The scholarship was created by gift from the parents and husband of Cheryl Crosier Wilson (Wendell and Nola Crosier, Randy Wilson) as a memorial to her. The scholarship is intended for those who are pursuing study to become a registered nurse and eligible students must have maintained a minimum "B" average. Other selection criteria include need, character and scholastic ability. The recipient must study for the RN at Ohio University, and of the Ohio University branch campuses, University of Rio Grande, or Shawnee State University.

The selection committee includes the president of the Jackson City board of Education who serves as chairperson, the director of nursing at the Oak Hill Community Medical Center, a teacher of advanced science classes, a Jackson High School Counselor, and a teacher of senior Social Studies.

E. Sanford Kearns Fund for Science and Mathematics

The E. Sanford Kearns Fund for Science and Mathematics was established by a gift of 1,000 shares of FMC Corporation from Carlos Miller, a professor of biology at the University of Indiana and a member of the Jackson City Schools Hall of Honor.

It was established in honor of E. Sanford Kearns, a teacher of science and mathematics at Jackson High School for many years, and the fund has been augmented by subsequent donations. The fund provides for an annual cash award to a graduating senior at JHS and is to be applied to the costs of engaging in advanced training in science and/or mathematics. The award is based primarily upon proven scholarship in science and/or mathematics. The recipient is also to receive an individual plaque and to have his/her name engraved on a permanent plaque placed in the high school.

The awards committee is to be decided by the superintendent of schools, but is to include three or more teachers of the various sciences and mathematics as well as a representative from the high school administration and one from the board of education.

George E. Ridgeway Youth Leadership Association Scholarship- OU

This scholarship was established by the will of George E. Ridgeway, a 1933 graduate of JHS who became a teacher of mathematics and taught mathematics for a period of thirty-five years. He created this scholarship to help a graduating senior from JHS who was going to attend **Ohio University**. Students who apply for the scholarship must have membership in the JHS chapter of the YLA (formerly H-Y), must have leadership potential, and must have academic potential. Other selection criteria include character and need. The earnings from the original gift of \$31,484 provide for the annual scholarship.

The selection committee includes the president of the board of education who will chair the committee, the current advisor to the local Hi-Y chapter, the high school principal, a teacher by the high school principal and a minister appointed by the chairperson.

George E. Ridgeway Mathematics Scholarship To Ohio University- teaching

The scholarship was established by Mr. Ridgeway, a teacher of mathematics for thirty-five years, with a gift of \$31, 483.65 in 1987. The earnings from the gift support a one-year scholarship for a Jackson High School graduate attending Ohio University and preparing to become a mathematics teacher. Eligibility criteria include talent in mathematics, leadership potential, academic potential, character, need, and commitment to becoming a teacher of mathematics.

The selection committee will include the president of the board of education, who chairs the committee, the head of the mathematics department or the senior teacher of mathematics at JHS, the high school principal and a mathematics teacher selected by the high school principal.

Helen M. and Vernon C. Everett
Perpetual Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was endowed in 1994 from a gift from the estate of Dr. and Mrs. Everett consisting of 12% of the assets of a trust fund that they established. It supports two senior scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 or more, depending upon the earnings of the fund. The awards are based upon need, character, scholarship, academic ability and the goal of the applicant.

The selection committee includes the president of the school board of education, the high school principal, a teacher selected by the principal, and a high school counselor who has no voting rights. Applicants must have a "B" average or better (3.00 GPA). The recipient is to be announced at the annual awards ceremony.

Jackson High School Class of 1952
Scholarship Fund

This scholarship was established in 1991 by contributions from approximately fifty members of the Jackson High School class of 1952, and was established to honor the memory of their classmates who have died since their graduation in May of 1952, and also to honor the teachers, administrators, and the Board of Education members "who contributed unselfishly to their education in the Jackson City School System". The selection criteria requires that a recipient be selected who is "believed to possess those attributes of ability, character, temperament, and personality that are in accord with the high standards set by previous graduates of Jackson High School."

The award may be used by the recipient to apply toward the cost of his or her higher education, professional training or technical training.

Janelle Wolfe Scholarship

The Janelle Wolfe Scholarship was established in 1988 to honor the memory of the young lady, who had graduate from Jackson High School in 1987. It is supported by contributions, the earnings from which are used to provide an annual scholarship to a graduating JHS senior who intends to continue study in the area of **life science**, with a preference to those studying to prepare for careers in **animal care**.

The selection committee shall be made up of the president of the school board who will serve as chairperson, the most senior teacher of Zoology at JHS, and/or Sharon Wolfe (parents), their designee, or their next of kin and a senior class counselor who will serve as a non-voting member.

The Marcella Gates Scholarship

This scholarship was created in October 1998 by the Last Will and Testament of Mrs. Gates, who spent a career as a second-grade teacher at South Street Elementary School. The principal of the fund is to be preserved, but earnings are to be used for scholarship(s) to “worthy graduated students whose parents’ income is below the US Government established poverty guidelines. In addition to that provision, the award will be based upon need, character, academic ability and the goal of the applicant.

The selection committee is composed of the president of the board of education, the superintendent of schools, a teacher selected by the superintendent and a guidance counselor at Jackson High School. Multiple scholarships may be funded from this account in any given year.

The Marcella May Award In Music

The Marcella May Award was created by a gift of 200 shares of Telex common shares by her son, Carlos Miller, a professor of biology at the University of Indiana, and a member of the Jackson City Schools Hall of Honor. The original award has been supplemented by subsequent donations. The awards may be given to individuals, or, at the discretion of the awards committee, to a group and may be either in the form of cash or a scholarship.

The purpose is to promote originality, creativity, and excellence in the composition, conducting, performance or scholarship of **music** in the Jackson City Schools. Used shall be designated by the selection committee and may differ widely from year to year.

The selection committee is composed of the president of the Jackson City Board of Education who serves as the chairperson, the principal of JHS, an elementary school principal, the senior teacher of music in the high school, one other music teacher and one teacher who does not teach music.

The recipient is also to receive an individual plaque and to have his/her name engraved on a permanent plaque placed in the high school.

The Becky Kight Memorial Math Scholarship

This expendable trust scholarship was established in 1995 in honor of Mrs. Becky Kight, a teacher of **mathematics** at Jackson High School who died suddenly in the prime of her career.

Mayhew-Brown Funeral Home Charitable Scholarship

This scholarship was created by Jason and Shelley Brown, owners of the Mayhew-Brown Funeral Home. The amount given is \$1000, to any Jackson High School senior attending a public, private or community college upon graduation. Eligible seniors will have a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale. This scholarship can be used as payment toward tuition, room/board or books and supplies. This scholarship is non-renewable.

The scholarship committee will consist of 3 members, appointed each year by March 15.

The Bernard and Mary F. Brunton Scholarship

The scholarship was created in February of 2001 when Bernard and Mary F. Brunton of Jackson left their estate to the Jackson City School District for the purposes of establishing a scholarship fund.

The scholarship has great flexibility in that it is not specific in terms of purpose or eligibility. The recipient of the award is selected by a committee composed of the superintendent of schools and two to three additional members appointed by the superintendent.

The Brett Shoemaker Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1996 in memory of Brett Shoemaker, a junior student who lost his life in an automobile accident during the last week of his junior year of high school. Brett was a **basketball and track participant** during his high school years. The scholarship was established by the Roundball Club, an adult basketball support group, in his memory. The award is based upon scholarship, athletic participation, financial need, and participation in other school activities.

The selection committee is composed of the high school principal, athletic director, senior class advisor and a senior counselor.

The amount of the award is determined annually by the Roundball Club, who will deposit the appropriate amount with the school treasurer.

The Ridgeway Brothers' Football Scholarship(Ohio University)

This scholarship is one of three created from the estate of George E. Ridgeway, a 1933 graduate of Jackson High School who subsequently has a 35 year career as a mathematics teacher, much of it in California. Mr. Ridgeway's gift, totaling approximately \$91,000 for three scholarships, was made available to the school district in 1987. The scholarship was created to honor the three Ridgeway brothers, George, Jim, and Mike, all of whom played football at Jackson High School. This scholarship is available to a letter earning football player at Jackson High School who subsequently attends Ohio University.

The selection criteria for the scholarship include **earning of a varsity letter in football, leadership potential, academic potential, character, and need.**

The selection committee includes the president of the board of education who serves as chairperson, the head football coach, the high school principal and a teacher selected by the high school principal.

Nancy A. Essex Scholarship

This scholarship is in memory of Nancy Essex and is intended for **Pre-Med or Social Work**. Must have a 2.7 GPA and show School/community service, goals, potential for success and financial need.

The Stockmeister Memorial Fund

This Scholarship is in memory of AJ and Bernadine Stockmeister. The selection committee is looking for JHS Senior students who excel in academics, character and participation in school activities and want to pursue a college degree.

The Tom & Chris Jenkins Vocational and Technical Scholarship

This scholarship is established to provide a freshman scholarship to a student to encourage post-secondary study in the area of **trade & technology programs** of two years or less. *This would include programs such as welding schools and adult vocational programs at vocational career centers such as Buckeye Hills.*

The scholarship committee shall consist of the JHS Principal, JHS Counselor and Tom or Chris Jenkins.

The Earl & Ruth Lemaster Agriculture Scholarship

This Scholarship goes to a Senior going into an **Agriculture** related field.

The Dwight W. Jones Family Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in February, 2014, in memory of Dwight W. Jones and Mary Elizabeth Jones, both graduates of Jackson High School. The initial award (s) are being made possible through memorial contributions made In Memory of Mary Elizabeth Jones, who recently passed away in February of 2014

The purpose of the scholarship is intended to encourage, and help graduating senior student applicants attain their post-secondary educational goals, pursuing a two or four year degree in their chosen field of study at an accredited institution.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria as follows:

Application submitted/completed

Financial Need Minimum High School Cumulative GPA 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) through the seventh semester of their senior year Submission of (250–500 words) written essay containing information, such as to what field of study student has chosen to pursue, why he/she has chosen that particular field of study, and discuss future goals and career objectives related to field of study Scholarship monies may be used for tuition, room and board or purchase of books.

Strong desire to further education

The Melissa Grimes Farely Memorial Scholarship

This Scholarship was created in 2015 to honor Melissa Grimes Farley. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA. Emphasis will be given to a student majoring in Education in Special Needs/ Intervention.

The Larry Taylor Memorial Football Scholarship

This scholarship was established in April, 2003 in memory of Larry Dean Taylor, in 1966 graduate of Jackson High School. Mr. Taylor was a devoted supporter of the Jackson High School football program.

Applicants for this scholarship must have played football at Jackson High School. It is also a requirement that the applicant be a young person who has exhibited standards of good sportsmanship. The applicant must be accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning.

The recipient is to be announced at the annual awards ceremony and at commencement activities.

The W.S. Lofland Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Lofland scholarship was provided by a gift of \$10,000 by Mrs. Ruth Lofland in 1991 in order to create a memorial for her late husband. Eligible students must have maintained a "B" average in school, and must exhibit need, character, scholarship, and have a goal of pursuing any four-year degree program.

The selection committee includes the president of the board of education who serves as the chairperson, the high school principal, a teacher selected by the principal, a counselor, and a teacher of senior level social studies.

The Martha Walke Scholarship

This scholarship is in memory of beloved JCS teacher Martha Walke. It is intended to help a JHS student follow Martha's career path to become a teacher.

Selection criteria:

2.5 GPA

Selection based on Goal of applicant and financial need

The Chris Bullion Memorial Scholarship

The Chris Bullion Memorial Scholarship was established to honor the memory of Mr. Chris Bullion, choir director at Jackson City Schools from

2002-2010. To be eligible for this scholarship, a student must have a 3.2 GPA and have been a four year member of the JHS choir program (concert or symphonic choir). In addition, the student must plan to major or minor in vocal music OR be likely to remain active in vocal music throughout their life.

David Brooks Jones Scholarship

The David Brookes Jones Scholarship is in memory of one time Jackson resident David Brooks Jones, the son of the late Jackson industrial leader and philanthropist Edwin (Eddie) Jones and his wife Katharine, made a national name for himself in regional theater. This scholarship requires a 3.0 GPA and a 25 on the ACT. The applicant must have participated in performing or vocal arts 3 out the 4 high school years.

Roberta L. Grimes Commercial (Business) Award

This Scholarship is in memory of Roberta L. Grimes, a long time JHS teacher and is intended for a student going to college and majoring in a **business** related field. The first place winner receives two-thirds of the earnings and the second place winner gets one third of the earnings.

Rachel Coyan Tripp Memorial Scholarship for Psychology at Ohio University

This Scholarship is in memory of Rachel Coyan Tripp, former JHS and Ohio University student. Applicants must have a 3.5 GPA and be accepted to Ohio University with a major in Psychology. Applicant's goals, scholarship, financial need and school/ community service will be considered.

Robert A. and Beverly Hunter Meng Scholar Athlete Scholarship

There will be two scholarships awarded - one for a boy and another for a girl to be awarded to students with at least a 3.2 GPA, lettered in at least one sport, have participated in at least two community and/or school recognized extracurricular activities and has financial need. The school system follows state guidelines when determining financial need. The one time award amount will be for \$1,500.00 each.

James Edgar Evans Scholarship

Dr. James Edgar Evans loved his community and before passing in 2015 wanted to establish a scholarship fund to give back to the community that supported him and his family. Dr. Evans was a graduate of Ohio University in 1966, and was awarded the Doctor of Optometry degree from The Ohio State University in 1970. He attended Wellston High School and was a 1962 graduate of Culver Military Academy. Furthermore, Dr. Evans was a veteran of the United States Navy, for which he served 4 years, and the Ohio Air National Guard, from which he retired in 2005 with 34 years of dedicated service. Dr. Evans was a well-known optometrist in Jackson and Vinton counties for the past four decades. During that time, Dr. Evans was very active in his community and was a member of many civic, community, and business organizations.

The Carl R. Wooten Family Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in June, 2017, in memory of Carl Wooten. Carl was a 1964 graduate of Jackson High School and devoted supporter of Jackson Athletics.

The purpose of the scholarship is intended to aid a graduating senior planning to pursue a two or four year degree in the field of education or nursing. The award will be based upon scholarship, athletic participation, financial need, and participation in other school activities.

The selection committee will consist of the high school principal, senior counselor, athletic director, and member of the family.

Jackson Pride Scholarship

To be eligible for the scholarship, a student must be a graduating senior from Jackson High School. Applicants must maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0 at the time of application and anticipate completion of high school diploma. Recipients must be accepted to and enrolled in an accredited undergraduate program. To be considered for the scholarship, eligible students must submit high school transcripts, two letters of recommendation (*letters from relatives will not be accepted*), a typewritten resume (12 point font) detailing education, work experience (*if applicable*), accolades, achievements, extra-curricular activities, and community service/involvement. In addition students must complete the 1-2 page essay “*the PRIDE of Jackson, what being an Ironmen really means to me and for my future.*”

Class of 1951 Scholarship- Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. 2.5 minimum GPA
2. Financial need, school & community service will be considered.

Class of 1962 Scholarship- must have 3.5 GPA

Kathryn Loxley Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is in memory of beloved long time Jackson City Schools Elementary teacher Kathryn Loxley

Hozers' Pizza Scholarship- must have 3.5 GPA

Emileigh Jo Cooper Memorial Scholarship – 3.0 GPA

Essay prompt : "*As you pursue your future, how do you plan to leave your personal legacy?*"

Beth Woolum-Caudill Memorial Scholarship- Background in music and a love of music 3.5 GPA

Neoteric Engineers Rewarding Determined Students (NERDS) Scholarship- STEM degree- two awarded-3.5 GPA EFC of under \$10K plus essay required. Prompt: "*Describe a real world problem and how pursuing a degree in STEM will give you the skills to solve that problem in 500-1000 words. The*

essay must not identify yourself by name, sex, race, color, creed, sexual orientation, or handicap."
